Roll Call



Jan Tadeusz Baxter (Zabłocki)

Jan Tadeusz Baxter (Zabłocki), one of the last surviving pilots of the wartime Polish Air Force, died on 12th of March, just short of his 101st birthday. Born in 1920 with the surname Zabłocki, he was selected for pilot training in Poland but did not complete his training before the outbreak of war. He escaped through central Europe to France, and from there to Britain where he was initially stationed at RAF Swinderby on ground duties with 300 Sqn, Polish Air Force. In 1943, after pilot training in Britain and Canada, he was posted back to 300 Sqn, now at RAF Ingham, flying Wellingtons mainly on mine-laying duties. He later converted to the Halifax's, and between Mar-May 1944, served in 1586

Special Duties Flight at Brindisi, Italy; flying 27 operational night sorties, 11 of which were to Poland, dropping supplies for the Home Army. He described how "Flying low over the DZ [Drop Zone] during the Drop, I opened the side window and felt a rush of clear Polish air ... The flights to Poland were exhilarating and, if the missions were accomplished, they gave a lot of satisfaction to myself and the crew. More than once I had the moving experience of seeing the lights of my home town, Kraków, in the distance." After this tour, he returned to England to serve as an instructor. He stayed in Britain after the war, flying commercially, including making 242 flights during the Berlin Airlift. In 1951 he joined the RAF and served in flying roles in Aden and Malaysia as well as home postings.

Józefa Solecka (nee Kawałek)

Józefa Solecka (nee Kawałek) was born Oct. 17, 1925 in Mosciskach, Poland. At the start of the war, the Soviets invaded Poland and she and her family were deported to a labour camp in Siberia. For two years, the family struggled to survive the atrocities of Stalin's regime. After the declaration of amnesty in 1942, her family were allowed to leave Siberia. Unable to return to Poland, the family resettled in the British territories in Tanganyika (now Tanzania), where she was a border guard. In 1943, Józefa joined the Polish Air Force in Africa and travelled first to Scotland and then England where she joined the 300 Sqn, at RAF Faldingworth, as a LACW Fabric Worker. In Lincolnshire, she met

her future husband, Warrant Offiocer Zbigniew Solecki, Wireless Operator, 300 Sqn. Jozefa was honoured with the Polish Golden Medal by the Polish Government, as well as the Siberian Medal for her hardship during WWII.




MAIN EXHIBITION CENTRE - Fundraising Appeal

During the Reception following this year's Polish Air Force Commemoration, we were delighted to be able to announce the official launch of our major fundraising appeal for the our new **Main Exhibition Centre** project.

Our aim is to create a globally unique Heritage Centre in the heart of Lincolnshire. Dedicated to remembering and celebrating the remarkable lives and stories of the men and women of the Polish Air Force Bomber Squadrons, who worked and flew alongside the RAF during WW2.

The project involves the complete renovation of the old 'Airmen's Mess', to create a new Main Exhibition Centre building, with a combined exhibition space of 290.95m²; featuring two Exhibition Halls, a Cinema/Media Suite, a Polish Families Resettlement Hut, Research Facility, Meeting Room, Cafe and Toilets.



Michael Czajkowski 's eagerly awaited annual talk took place on Thursday 16 September, at Petwood Hotel, Woodhall Spa.




This year's talk is entitled:

They're made from recycled plastic, so wont deteriorate or need annual maintenance, as would wooden furniture, and you have to look hard to spot they're recycled plastic.




